One Great Hour of Sharing

Our next Special Offering, administered by the Advocacy and Outreach Committee, is for the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) and is collected on Palm Sunday, April 2nd. Fish Banks for the OGHS will be distributed to the children during Children's Time on March 12th and collected on April 2nd. Please bring any extra change you may have to help the kids with their Fish Bank collection efforts.

In 2022, North raised \$4,440 for One Great Hour of Sharing. Together, congregations across the USA donated \$5.7 million to fund three critical programs for the less fortunate among us: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (32%), the Presbyterian Hunger Program (36%) and Self-Development of People

(32%). These three programs focus on material needs and their root causes – from direct famine and disaster relief to the implications of systemic poverty and structural racism from naturally occurring and human-caused phenomena.


Loving Our Neighbors as Yourself: a Multi-Religious Perspective

2022 Summary: The year 2022 ended with a \$7,705 deficit. This compared with a 2022 budgeted deficit of \$2,889.

Total income of \$389,559 was less than total expenses of \$397,264. We are extremely grateful for the generosity of the North Church community. Donations are the single largest component of income representing approximately 75% of total income. The church has tenants, both lease and not lease renters, in our building throughout the week. Building use income from our tenants was another significant source to our overall total income.

The expenses were higher than budgeted primarily in the areas of support staff and building maintenance. In the support staff category, more maintenance hours were incurred than budgeted. Building maintenance similarly was higher than budgeted largely due to major maintenance items year. incurred during the These maintenance items are reflective of an aging building that requires attention. Major maintenance items in 2022 included a new stove,

new windows in the office area and a door security system installation.
